MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

I am writing this newsletter a few days after the Memorial Day weekend, remembering, and celebrating those who made the ultimate sacrifice for our country. Sometimes we need to take time for reflection and gratitude. As we pass Q2 2022, I trust you are successfully navigating from virtual to hybrid to face to face interaction while remaining safe. We will continue to offer events and webinars that we hope will be of interest for you. At this time, I had hoped that we would have Covid behind us to schedule more in person meetings. Unfortunately, it appears that the new variants are on the rise. A big thank you to our trainees, working remotely, for their unselfish efforts during this period. The trainees are awesome.

Since the last Newsletter we have been inundated with news about new major investments in mainly our North Carolina state. After years of preparation Carolina has so far landed, Toyota (lithium battery plant), BOOM (supersonic airplanes) and VINFast (electric cars). All these companies have global organizations, and I am amazed that the Carolinas have been able to provide land and infrastructure to this development. Last year we also had Apple and Google that announced their investments in the Research triangle area, creating thousands of jobs over the next five to ten years. The bottom line is that we should be thankful to everyone that had the vision and strength to make this happen for a brighter future of the Carolinas.



However, it goes without saying that with this mega boom , with thousands of new residents pouring into the Triad area , we will face severe housing shortages. This will drive up housing prices, create supply issues and challenges finding additional employees. On top of that we have a high inflation rate (8.5% in April) and a fixed mortgage rate around 5.0%. Personally, I think these issues are the biggest challenges. We will follow this development and come back with more insights in our future Newsletters. At this time however, it looks like the Carolinas are unstoppable.

We are now approaching the summer period and we have not planned any major events or webinars but please watch out for any interesting new opportunities.

Our ambition in the fall is to plan for in person events that are related to the mega boom in the Carolinas.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE EXECUTIVE FORUM

Here are a few selections and quotes from the presenters at the Executive Forum in June 2022.

- · In the opening remarks by the Swedish Ambassador it was mentioned that we will expect a recession - so they recommended that we save for a rainy day.
- Life science is today Sweden's largest export sector.
- The largest Swedish company in the US is Securitas. (as a side note they said that the most secure alarm system is a dog, burglars do not like dogs and people)
- Related to Ukraine, the US and Europe are working on how to eliminate all fossil fuel (oil and gas) from Russia. Russia gets about 1BUSD per day from oil and gas and that is about the same amount as the war cost per day.
- 5G for America, the 5th generation is coming with faster communication and more data. It is interesting to note that companies still consider 5G to be in its inception.
- Another interesting observation is that the young generation ranks commodity as #2 after electricity that is higher than water! Also, the attention spans the last period has gone from 20 sec to 9 sec.
- More than 50% of all Americans get their information from social media The Swedish steel company SSAB talked about their journey to fossil free material, they also mentioned that steel is the biggest recycle material as it is recycled over and over.
- A survey shows that 80% of all Americans say that it is up to the corporations to become sustainable. They also stressed that location is the key to lower energy cost. It was also very positive to hear that the US is back on environmental issues.
